AZYLC offers a full sponsored and funded multi-day (5-day / 4-night) youth leadership in-residence conference educational and practical application and activities personal experience. Student delegates develop leadership skills via a structured and engaging academic and activities-based full curriculum package.

CURRICULUM

All AZYLC program classes and scheduled activities are led by skilled instructors and supervised by well-qualified team leaders and counselors. Daily program classes are participatory and develops team-building and collaborative problem-solving critical skillsets. The curriculum goal is to provide 50% of class time and activities dedicated to leadership development; 30% of class time is devoted to civics-based critical thinking and practical application activities involving the US government legislative process, US history, a comprehensive review of the US Constitution, national Patriotism exploratory discussions, and the basis of Americanism. The remaining 20% of the curriculum is devoted to the Free Enterprise System, entrepreneurship, and the US economy. AZYLC also partners with and is represented by Resolutions of Cooperation, e.g., Hugh O'Brien Youth Leadership, the National Sojourners, and the Joe Foss Institute.
